On September 8, 2011, International Literacy Day, The Centre and the Montreal Children's Hospital hosted a celebratory event with author Roch Carrier (*The Hockey Sweater*) and Canadian Astronaut Robert Thirsk. Dr. Thirsk took a copy of *The Hockey Sweater* when he spent six months on the international space station in 2009. Both men

shared stories about the love of books and reading that marked their childhood and shaped their careers. They entranced the audience of young and old. WRITERS IN THE COMMUNITY (WIC)

The Centre for Literacy, in collaboration with the Quebec Writers' Federation, offers and tracks the outcomes of writing workshop for Montreal adolescents and young adults excluded from the mainstream. WIC recently implemented a formal recruitment process to extend their roster of facilitators. Having hired three new artists with diverse skills and experience, they are offering an expanded WIC program this fall;; seven projects in five venues, two of them with new community partners. Another exciting development: WIC plans to hire a former student participant as an intern in his former school this fall. link.

MEASURES OF SUCCESS.

This research project is intended to measure the long-term outcomes of WLES programs through examining workplace learning initiatives in Nova Scotia and Manitoba. At the 2011 Summer Institute in Montreal, project team members described the project's research framework. The project has been designed to capture changes to the worksites, using measures of productivity, efficiency, absenteeism, retention, and morale, as well as changes to the learners, using measures of human capital, social capital, self-confidence, and practices inside and outside the worksite.
