## WRITERS' IN THE COMMUNITY (WIC)

<u>Writers' in the Community</u> is flourishing. After five years of continuous activity, the program has expanded. Two new partnerships have been formed with a rehabilitation centre and a community centre. A former student participant was hired as an intern to assist the facilitators in his former school while he engages in his own creative and professional development. The writer-facilitators are building a fund of specialized knowledge and ideas which they will share with other writers at a round table discussion in December 2011. # **FAMILY LITERACY DAY**

The Centre will collaborate again with the Montreal Children's Hospital on the annual Family Literacy Day — January 27, 2012. A Grand Rounds lecture to health professionals will kick off the day. Last year hundreds of families and staff stopped at our tables, thousands of books were given to children and information about literacy was given to parents.

#### **RAISE-A-READER**

Raise-A-Reader (Quebec) has selected The Centre as one of the 2011 recipient organizations for the <u>Lire/Imagine/Read</u> project at <u>Montreal Children's Hospital</u>. Funds will purchase books for the children and create literacy handouts for families on <u>Family Literacy Day</u>. The Centre in collaboration with the Montreal Children's Hospital developed Lire/Imagine/Read to integrate literacy promotion and the love of reading into health care for children. It is adapted from <u>Reach Out and Read</u> in the U.S.
