4. Research Scan – September 2012

Featured in this month's research scan: Reports from the Canadian Literacy and Learning Network (CLLN)'s Literacy and Earnings Project, including a report by The Centre for Literacy on the link between literacy and essential skills and earnings; an update on the Programme for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIAAC); British research on training programs for the unemployed, the effect of ageing on literacy/numeracy skills and workforce disadvantage, and on local accountability for adult education provision. The scan also includes the OECD's Education at a Glance report on rates of investment and participation in adult education, and an American study of a family literacy program in Texas.
